

Students! The following Early College and Career credits were achieved by our Brickies in 2021:

- 795 students receiving Early College Credits
- Total Early College Credits earned: 7299
- Total projected money saved: \$1, 091,565.45
- We had our second cohort of students (23) completing the Indiana College Core, which is a 30-credit sequence that will transfer to public universities in Indiana as one year of college.
- We had 24 seniors who earned their Associate's Degree this school year, which means they will leave Hobart High School with both a high school diploma AND a two-year college degree. For the first time ever, we have a student earning their Associate's in Medical Assisting and another student earning their Associate's in Energy Technology.
- We had 8 students earning a Certificate or Technical Certificate in Business Administration, Energy Technology, Medical Assisting, CNA and Dementia Care, and Basic Emergency Medical Studies.

Welcome Back To School Letter From Dr. Buffington!

BRICKIE FORWARD

THE SCHOOL CITY OF HOBART (SCOH) WILL IMPLEMENT THE FOLLOWING GUIDELINES:

#1 MASK WEARING IS RECOMMENDED BY THE CDC/IDOH & IS NOT REQUIRED EXCEPT FOR ON BUSES AT THIS TIME.

- Masks can be worn by anyone.
- Universal indoor masking for all teachers, staff, and students, regardless of vaccination status is recommended, but not required at this time.
- Masks are required on buses by all people per federal mandate.
- Masks should be carried at all times in cases of need.
- Masks are encouraged in crowded areas where distancing is limited.
- In areas of substantial or high transmission, wearing a mask in public indoor settings is recommended, not required at this time.
- Wearing a mask regardless of the level of transmission, particularly if they are immunocompromised or at increased risk for severe disease from COVID-19, or if they have someone in their household who is immunocompromised, at increased risk of severe disease or not fully vaccinated is recommended.
- Enhanced precautions for early return of a quarantined individual will require masking on days 8-14.
- SCOH will follow county guidance if traveling to a county with more stringent guidelines.

Individuals who are fully vaccinated do not need to quarantine, but should continue to monitor daily for symptoms and report them to the school nurse.

* SCOH will monitor community spread data of COVID which will guide changes for masking and follow guidelines required by governmental authorities.

#2 KNOW THE SYMPTOMS!

- Temperature 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit or higher when taken by mouth.
- Sore throat.
- New uncontrolled cough that causes difficulty breathing (for students with chronic allergic/asthmatic cough, a change in their cough from baseline).
- Diarrhea, vomiting, or abdominal pain.
- New onset of severe headache, especially with a fever.

#3 SELF-SCREEN & COMMUNICATE WITH THE SCHOOL

- In Skyward, parents need to report the conditions when calling off a child.
- Parents will utilize the Absence Requests section in Skyward.
- Parents will have options to select the symptom(s) a child is exhibiting or have an opportunity to explain such symptoms as they relate to a known medical condition.
- Contact the SCOH nurse if there are COVID symptoms at nurse@hobart.k12.in.us.

#4 PRACTICE GOOD HYGIENE

Teach the importance of not touching your face. Teach and reinforce good hygiene practices like hand washing, using hand sanitizer, covering sneezes/coughs, and keeping one's hands to them self. Teach the proper storage of a mask in case it is needed.

#5 COVID-19 SYMPTOMATIC, POSITIVE TEST EXPOSURE, ASYMPTOMATIC, RETURN TO SCHOOL RULES: INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE FULLY VACCINATED DO NOT NEED TO QUARANTINE, BUT SHOULD CONTINUE TO MONITOR DAILY FOR SYMPTOMS AND REPORT THEM TO THE SCHOOL NURSE.

Rules are recommended from the CDC and the Indiana State Department of Health. Contact the SCOH nurse to find out the specifics for your circumstances which include the following:

Quarantine and isolation rules

- BinaxNow Testing at the school with parent permission for an Early Return to school if negative.
- Enhanced precautions for early return to school - will require masking on days 8-14.

Your school nurse can explain the rules for student/staff depending on the situation. Contact the nurse at nurse@hobart.k12.in.us.

Conditions for Quarantine:

- Individuals who are fully vaccinated do not need to quarantine, but should continue to monitor daily for symptoms and report them to the school nurse.
- People are encouraged to wear masks as recommended by the CDC/IDOH.
- School City of Hobart will contact trace at 6ft.
- Assigned seats and seating charts must be maintained in all classes, lunchrooms, and buses.
- Close Contact:** An individual who was within 6 feet of a person diagnosed with COVID-19 for a total of 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period.
 - This applies regardless of whether either person was wearing a mask except in the following situations: All students are masked and are 3ft. or more apart in a classroom; or students are 6ft. or more apart in all other school day settings.
- Quarantine must be used for unvaccinated students, teachers, and staff who have been exposed to someone with COVID-19. Close contacts should quarantine unless they are fully vaccinated, or have tested positive in the last three months, or do not have any symptoms.
 - All fully vaccinated people who remain asymptomatic (even if a close contact) do not need to quarantine but should monitor for symptoms for 14 days following exposure.
 - Enhanced precautions for early return of a quarantined individual will require masking on days 8-14.



Hobart University is providing many opportunities for our students! Our Brickies are accomplishing more than they could ever imagine while in high school... and it is all for FREE!

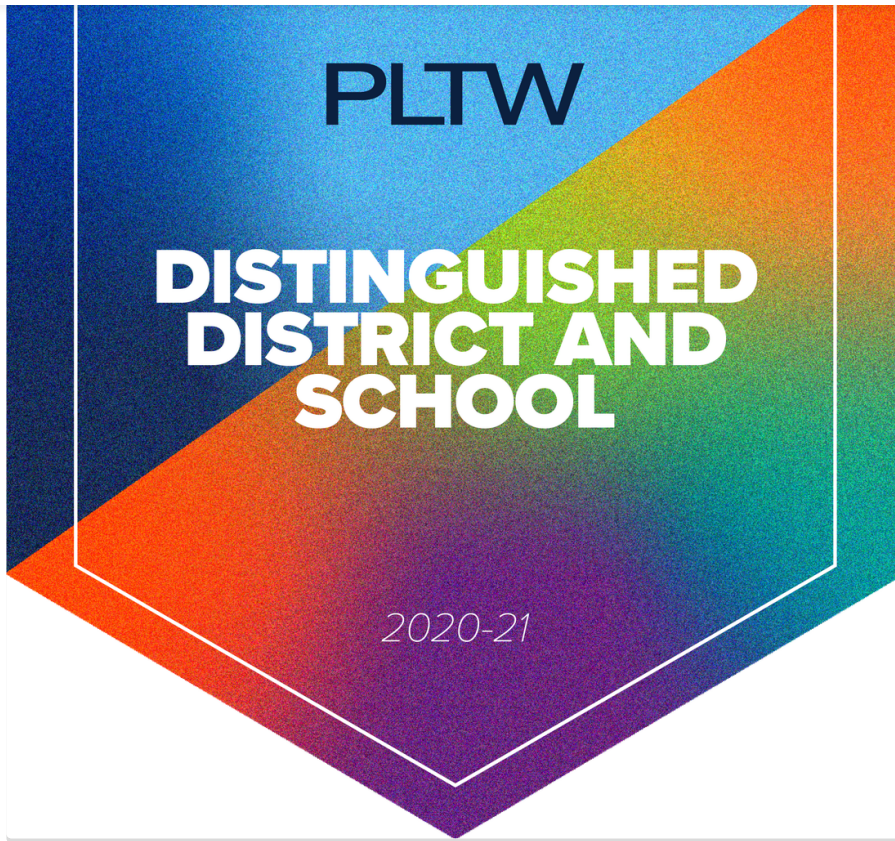

HepB: The minimum age for the 3rd dose of Hepatitis B is 24 weeks of age.

DTaP: 4 doses of DTaP/DT are acceptable if 4th dose was administered on or after child's 4th birthday.

Polio: 3 doses of Polio are acceptable for all grade levels if the 3rd dose was given on or after the 4th birthday and at least 6 months after the previous dose.

*For all students, the final dose must be administered on or after the 4th birthday and be administered at least 6 months after the previous dose.

Varicella: Physician documentation of disease history, including month and year, is proof of immunity for children entering preschool through 12th grade. Parent report of disease history is not acceptable.

Tdap: There is no minimum interval from the last Td dose.

MCV4: Individuals who receive dose 1 on or after the 16th birthday only need 1 dose of MCV4.

Hepatitis A: The minimum interval between 1st and 2nd dose is 6 calendar months. 2 doses are required for all grades.

STATE ATTENDANCE LAW



Pursuant to Indiana compulsory attendance laws (Indiana Code 20-33-2), students are required to be in attendance for the school's educational program for 180 days per school year. Absences from school are only permitted per school regulations as defined in the student handbook.

Students will be allowed up to 10 absences per semester that will be considered excused with appropriate notification and documentation. Absences beyond 10, regardless of the reason, will be considered unexcused.

If there are excessive absences for "illness", the parents will be required to provide a statement from a physician describing the health condition. Without such a statement, the student's permanent attendance record will indicate unexcused absences. Additionally, failure to provide medical documentation, or comply with the school's request for certification, may result in a report to the Department of Child Services for the educational neglect.

Truancy from school is not acceptable. A student shall be considered a "habitual truant" when the student is chronically absent by having unexcused absences from school for more than ten (10) school days in one (1) school year. Students who are truant will receive no credit for school work that is missed.

The Department of Child Services may be contacted for educational neglect when students accumulate more than 10 unexcused absences. In the case of truancy, the Juvenile Court System and/or Juvenile Probation Department may be contacted.

What needs to happen before Fall 2021

Grade 9-11 → Create Dual Enroll Account

- Visit ivytech.dualenroll.com. **ALL students** must create a dual enroll account.*
 - Social Security Number and Contact information are required.
 - Within a few hours, students will receive a Welcome Email from Ivy Tech.
 - The email will include an Ivy Tech student ID (C#) needed for next steps.

*Creating a dual enroll account has two functions for students that have never completed a DC app previously: 1) it gets them into the dual enroll system and 2) it serves the same function as the dual credit application previously. Students that have previously filled out a DC App must still create their own account at ivytech.dualenroll.com. These students will have their preexisting DC application linked to their new dual enroll account automatically!

MyIvy is the student access portal for your account, college email, and other important student resources including Knowledge Assessment!

*Forgot your User ID? Click on the "Reset or Forget Password" link at myivy.ivytech.edu and then select "Don't know your Ivy Tech Email Address?" You will then be prompted to enter some personal information at which time you will be provided with your Ivy Tech email!

Have Students Complete Knowledge Assessment (KA)

- When logged in to MyIvy (see step above), students click on "Student" and then "Student Dashboard".
- Scroll down the page and click on the graphic called "Knowledge Assessment"
- Students may be prompted to re-enter their Ivy Tech username and password.
- The two "keys" automatically entered in student accounts are: ENGLISH and STEM.
- Students will click GO TO GOAL and START Diagnostic for each.



The target scores for each key is as follows:

- ENGLISH - Score of a 70
- STEM - Score of a 70

If students do not meet these target scores, students will need to continue within the customized study paths to raise their score(s) to a 70.

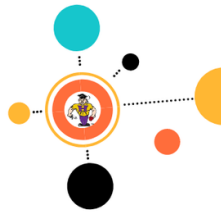

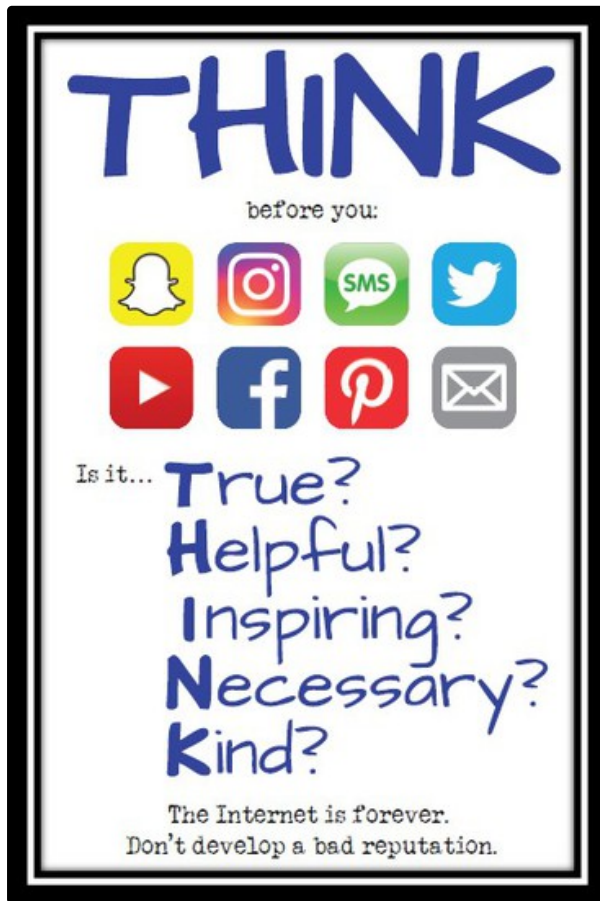
