
The Bricks are now 11-5 on the year in duals and will lace them up again next Saturday at IHSWCA Team State! GO GET 'EM GUYS!!





















Dedication of the Steve Balash Wrestling Room!

This wrestling room is named in honor of Coach Steve Balash, whose presence in Hobart made a lasting impact on the school and entire community.

Steve Balash graduated from Hobart High School in 1968 where he was an outstanding three sport athlete for the Brickies. In 1972, after earning his degree from Indiana State, he returned to Hobart as an educator for the School City. For nearly 50 years, Coach Balash served as football coach, wrestling coach and track coach. In addition to his coaching responsibilities, he taught metal shop, wood shop, health and physical education.

Remembered as one of the most respected individuals of his time, Coach Balash was a gentle giant who led by example, spoke from the heart, and was never too busy to lend an ear or a hand. He was admired universally for his toughness as well as his care for others. A gentle smile could always be found underneath his trademark mustache.

Beyond being a teacher and coach, Steve was a mentor and friend to many and unselfishly gave of his time and energy to educate both students and colleagues to be the very best they could be. He proudly bled purple and gold, taught boys how to become men and kids how to become adults.

During his nearly 50-year career in education, Steve taught roughly 10,000 students and coached 150 seasons (football, wrestling & track) all at Hobart. He coached in 55 state championship events spanning all 3 sports. In wrestling alone, his teams won 305 matches and saw 64 individuals advance to the state finals ... 12 of those went on to win titles. Among Coach Balash's personal honors were his induction into the Hobart High School Athletic Hall of Fame, Indiana Wrestling Coaches Hall of Fame, and Indiana Football

Coaches Hall of Fame.

The Steve Balash Wrestling Room is a permanent anchor in the School City of Hobart and a fitting tribute to the memory of a wonderful man who was larger than life. He truly personified everything it means to be a Hobart Brickle.




The Brickies are now 4-5 on the year and will travel to Westville on Friday for a non-conference game against the Blackhawks!! GOOD LUCK GUYS!!
